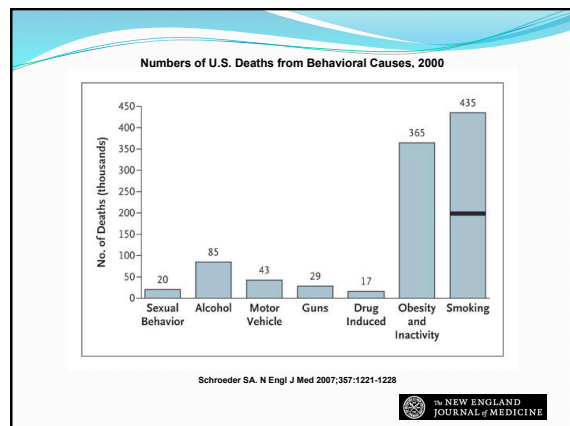
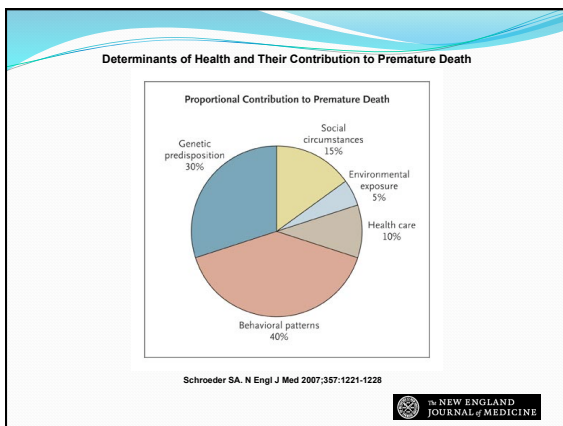


Health Status of the United States and Rank among the 29 Other OECD Member Countries

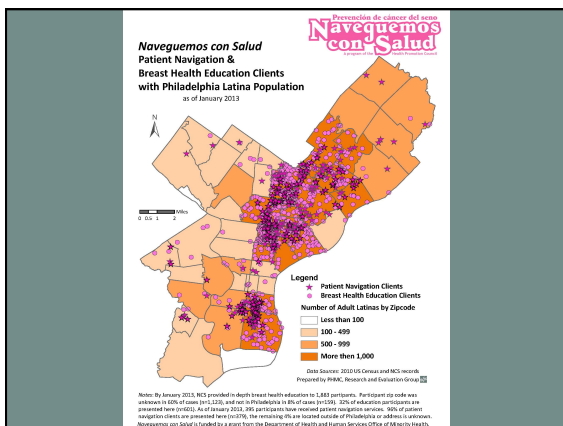
